INTRODUCTION

It seems like yesterday that Lan and I returned from Bali, and here we are, off on another trip – this time to Portugal, Spain, and France, with side visits to Amsterdam and Brugge with our two grandsons, who are now 15 and 11. As we will be away for most of July, this edition of the newsletter is being prepared in advance, and contains useful information on no fewer than 13 new maps on 9 new sheets, a testament to Lan and her team of dedicated cartographers. It also contains a first for us – a lovely new atlas covering Japan.

NEW TITLES AND NEW RELEASES AS OF EARLY JULY, 2025

This past month has seen further shipments from our printer of new titles. Some of them are for maps for which we still have inventory, so these will be stored until existing inventory runs out. However, we are pleased to announce the arrival of nine new titles covering 13 different mapping entities. This is almost a record for us, but we are confident that you will see these new releases as valuable additions to your marketing operations. For Canada, we have the most recent edition of our popular **Atlantic Canada** map, covering the four provinces that occupy the Atlantic coastline close to Europe, relatively speaking. On the other side of the world, we now have a completely updated map of **Australia**. Back to Canada and we have the recreational **Bowron Lakes Canoe Route** map, combined with an updated map of nearby **Wells Gray Park**, both in British Columbia. This new map combines two maps that were on separate sheets in past editions. We then move over the pond to the Middle East to announce our new map of **Dubai and the United Arab Emirates**, then back to Europe for an exciting new map of **Great Britain**, which also includes most of the Republic of Ireland. Next, we jump to Asia for an exciting new **Japan Rail and Road Atlas** in an expanded format on 112 pages full of useful information. Then, we hop back to Europe for an exciting new map of **Rome and Central Italy** before moving south to Africa and a new double-sided map covering **Senegal and Gambia**. SUMMER TRAVEL TO COMPIEGNE

Politics notwithstanding, summer is here, along with school breaks, and tens of millions of people are travelling, and what better country to visit than France? For most potential visitors, seeing Paris is all they know about France, and of course the Eiffel Tower, Notre Dame, and the Louvre Museum are extremely popular sites, so much so that restrictions now apply as to how many can visit at any point in time. A hundred kilometers north of Paris is the ancient city of Compiegne, a city founded by Germanic Franks sometime in the fifth century, long before France evolved as a country, but whose empire of Francia eventually became the heart of the country we now call France.

Fast forward to the 1300s and the concept of France as a country emerges in the unlikely form of a young girl names Joan of Arc, who articulated a vision that led millions of people to rebel and create a new country. She was eventually captured by forces loyal to the Duke of Burgundy, in Compiegne, and sold to the British, who tried her and burned her at the stake, not that such an action enhanced their cause. A statue of Joan stands in the main square of Compiegne.

The Chateau Compiegne dates from this time period and was the favoured country estate of royalty for many centuries, being expanded and renovated repeatedly. After the French Revolution, Napoleon restored it as his favourite residence, and it is, to Napoleon, what Versailles was to Louis XIV. It can be visited today as a museum, without the crowds besetting Versailles. The town retains a medieval appearance, with cobbled streets and centuries-old buildings, but the reason Compiegne is so important rests with modern history. It was here, in a forest clearing known as The Glade, that Germany was forced to sign the humiliating armistice ending World War 1 in 1918, in a railway coach that symbolized Germany's defeat. When Hitler conquered France in 1940, he insisted that the French had to surrender in that same railway coach, which still stood in that Glade. The coach was taken to Berlin in 1944 to keep it from falling back into Allied hands. In the last stages of the war, in April, 1945, Hitler ordered it transported to a remote forest and destroyed by fire to prevent it from ever being used to humiliate Germany again. Of course, the irony of this was completely lost on the allied powers, who were intent on the unconditional surrender of NAZI Germany and didn't even remember that the coach existed.

However, the glade in which the coach had stood retained enormous symbolic importance for the French, with General Koenig liberating the city on September 1st, 1944 and holding a military parade on the site of the railway coach. On November 11th, 1950, Remembrance Day, a replica coach was installed in the same position in Compiegne Glade and can be seen to this day, with an accompanying museum. Compiegne has one more monument worth seeing. The last train to Buchenwald left here on August 14, 1944, shortly before the Allies liberated Paris, carrying 1,250 Jewish and French resistance fighters to their deaths. The site of the internment camp is now a remembrance forest containing only a single gravestone to pay homage to the 40,000 individuals sent to extermination camps from her. Visit the site; it is important, less we forget.

A TRAVEL SITE YOU WILL NEVER SEE

The super-rich of our world use London as a venue to move illicit money, gaining the city the moniker of 'The London Laundromat'. Using thousands of shell companies based in offshore colonial islands such as the British Virgins, trillions of dollars are sequestered tax free by people like Vladimir Putin, King Abdullah of Jordan, Mexican drug cartels, and kleptomaniac heads of companies and countries all over the world. The richest 1% of the world's population controls \$450 trillion in illicit wealth, some 10 times the total debt of the USA. TRIVIA

At a time of great change and political turmoil, individuals feel comforted by everyday things that we all take for granted. Here are a few examples:

- 9. Caesar Salad is not named after Julius Caesar, nor does it have anything to do with Italy. It originated in the 1920s in Tijuana, Mexico, by chef Casar Cardini as a salad where one would dip the salad in a dish of sauce. The idea of including the sauce in the salad only came about much later.
- 10. Why are astronauts called that? The origin comes from ancient Greek astros for star and nautes for sailor. The Russians, not to be outdone, call their space explorers cosmonauts, invoking the Greek word for the universe, kosmos, and the word nautes. If you didn't know that then you've learned something today!

All four are traditional historic entities, with Newfoundland being the oldest British overseas area in the world, having been founded in 1534. New Brunswick was founded by the French as Acadia. The English deported many settlers to Louisiana Territory, where descendants to this day are proud to call themselves Cajuns. Nova Scotia started as a British naval fortress in Halifax (1749) and PEI is where Canada came together as a country in 1864. History is everywhere, making the region one of the most popular destinations in North America. Side 1 shows New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, with its adjacent Cape Breton Island, and PEI, while side 2 shows Newfoundland, an island, and Labrador, on the mainland, with a detailed inset map of Saint John's, the provincial capital and a thriving fishing port. **AVAILABLE**

Side 2 concentrates on the more lightly-populated western half, with an excellent inset map of Melbourne. British Columbia is as large as all of western Europe and has, of course, a lot of wilderness. The Bowron Lakes is a vast region, consisting of a series of lakes that form an almost perfect oblong-shaped square, with easy portages between the lakes. It takes canoeists a week to paddle the nine lakes and return to the only land access to this wilderness area. Numerous camping sites are available for canoeists to rest overnight, and no motorized water craft are allowed, ensuring a pristine wilderness experience. The Bowron Lakes are unique in the world and fill one side of this double-sided map. The second side is devoted to a nearby (in Canadian terms, that means within several hundred kilometers) called Wells Gray. The heart of this wilderness area is the provincial park of the same name, which occupies an area approximately the size of Belgium. In addition, the map covers popular recreational lakes such as Canim, Mahood, Quesnel, Horsefly, and Canoe Reach, which in itself is a hundred kilometers long. Two hundred wilderness campsite are noted on this map, which probably contains four hundred lakes. The recreational opportunities are endless – snowmobile trails in winter become hiking and horse trails in summer, backroads are plentiful, parks frequent, and good, clean air is everywhere. Despite the turmoil affecting both Israel and Iran, this part of the Middle East is open for business and peaceful. Side 1 concentrates on the overall region from the eastern border of the UAE to its interaction with Oman. It also has an excellent inset map of Abu Dhabi, the capital of the UAE. Side 2 concentrates on Dubai itself as the largest urban area. Dubai has an extensive and interesting old town on the east bank of the Dubai Creek, which is where most of the hotels and the huge international airport are located. The 'new town' is on the left bank, and this is where one finds Western-style shopping areas, high-rise towers, the rapid transit line, and the main motorway out of town. The World Trade Center and Emirates Towers are also centrally located. The manmade Coastal Projects are shown in insets. The British Isles includes all of Ireland, Great Britain only includes Ulster, or Northern Ireland, and United Kingdom refers to the political entity of England, Scotland, Wales, and Ulster, excluding the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, which are part of Great Britain, but not part of the United Kingdom. Most confusing. In any case, this is a thoroughly updated map of Great Britain, with Scotland and Northern Ireland on side 1, along with most of Northern England, and inset maps of the Orkney Islands and the Shetland Islands. Side 2 concentrates on Wales and southern England, with the eastern part of the Republic of Ireland. It also includes the Isle of Man and an inset of the Channel Islands, as well as a tiny bit of France in order to show the ferry and undersea train connections joining Britain to the continent. The map is quite detailed and is designed for the visitor wishing to have the entire country on one sheet of paper. GB is a densely populated country with an extensive road and rail network and is loaded with castles, fortresses, cathedrals, historic sites, famous gardens, ferries to various countries, and national parks. There is an incredible amount of information on this map, including secondary and tertiary roads, hundreds of villages, and all rail lines with passenger service. Just to complicate matters, all the counties and named and their borders are shown. Britain is one of the most visited countries in the world, and never ceases to amaze visitors with its wealth of fascinating heritage sites. This is an extremely comprehensive map of GB. AVAILABLE

ITMB publishes a map of the country and several sectional maps of portions, in greater detail, as well as several city maps. A few years ago, ITMB published a pocket-sized atlas of the country that proved to be successful, but in our minds did not quite do justice to this marvellous country. We spent last summer exploring Japan and re-designed our artwork into an expanded rail and road atlas that we feel is superior to the previous attempt. It looks good, it has detailed street maps of Tokyo, Osaka, Kobe, Nara, and Sapporo, and several pages of place names at the end of its 112 pages. Best of all, it has a self-portrait of grandson Johnny gazing at Osaka Castle as a cover picture. This atlas covers all of Japan, from Okinawa to the northern tip of Hokkaido, at a scale that is easy to read and attractively presented. All the rail lines are shown, with the high-speed Shinkansen lines being differently shown. Japan also has a host of ferry routes, being a series of islands, and these are shown as well. Everything that a visitor could want is contained within this compact, useful booklet. **AVAILABLE**

Centred on the north-south Taverna River, the map encompasses all of Vatican City in the west to the main railway station in the east, and from the massive Basilica San Paulo Fuori in the south to the Olympic Stadium in the north. Naturally, all the famous Roman and medieval sites are shown, as well as a good selection of hotels, churches, museums, and theatres, including all of the preserved Roman remains. The second side concentrates on central Italy north of Rome, from Bologna/Ravenna south to Termoli, showing rail and road connections. The tiny enclave of San Marino is also included, as are several off-shore islands. This would be an excellent map to explore fabulous cities such as Siena. Florence, Pisa, or Rieti, or just to discover that Rome's ocean port is actually at Civitavecchia, about 60 kms north of the city. This is where most cruise ships dock! **AVAILABLE**

Senegal & Gambia Travel Reference Map 7th Edition 2025 1:500,000 ISBN 9781771297394 UPC 817712973948 \$14.95cdn/us E/GBP 10.90 – Both Senegal and neighbouring Gambia would not exist, except for colonialism Dakar is one of the great harbours of the world, and dominated French West Africa until the 1960s. Gambia was created by literally bombing the countryside surrounding the Gambia River, with the British claiming all the land that fell within range as British territory, which is why Gambia has such and unusual shape. Both areas were heavily-invested in the slave trade, with Ile de Goree now being a museum to man's inhumanity to man. The map is double-sided, with western Senegal/Gambia on one side and the eastern portions of both countries on the reverse side. There is a rail line from Dakar going inland, but it is believed to carry only freight and no longer goes as far as Tambacounda. When I was first in the country, in 1969, I loaded my VW camper van on to a flatcar in Tambacounda and rode into then-isolationist Mali. At that time, this was the only way to enter that country. Road conditions in both Senegal and Gambia is somewhat variable. Both countries have encouraged the construction of resorts along the Atlantic coastline. Technically called the Society Islands, Tahiti, Moorea, Bora Bora, Raiatea and the other islands constitute a haven of peace and tranquility in a world of turmoil. Side One places the islands in relation to other portions of the Pacific Ocean, such as Hawaii, Pitcairn, Samoa, and New Zealand, while providing detailed island maps of Rarotonga, Aitutaki, and Vava'u while Side 2 provides detailed maps of a dozen Polynesian islands and an inset of Papeete, the capital. A Top Attractions list is included, as well as a comprehensive listing of hotels/resorts on different islands. With the breakup of the Soviet empire in 1989/90, this became Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Turkmenistan, and the other 'stans', excluding Afghanistan. This map concentrates on the area as a region, from the Caspian Sea to the Hindu Kush knot of Himalayan mountains and from the Russian border south to the Iranian and Afghan borders. **AVAILABLE**

The country, generally, is stable and open for tourism, although the southern border should be avoided. Side 1 portrays the entire country in excellent detail, with Tripoli and Jbail (ancient Byblos) being very nice places to visit north of Beirut itself. Of course, ancient Baalbek, a UNESCO Heritage Site in the interior, is the highlight of any visit to the country. Tunisia, for that matter, fills side 2 and includes a very good inset map of Tunis as well as a photo of the Amphitheatre of El Jem, which is still in use today, which seems remarkable.
